2022 CHRISTMAS LUNCHEON

We welcomed Associate Professor Andrew Kornberg to our Annual Christmas Lunch where he was presented with a cheque for \$10,000.

Andrew in responding, reminisced on his long association with the IN Group from the time of his first communication with James Gerrand, and how supportive the group has been of the research conducted at the Royal Children's Hospital – he has always been honoured to accept the group's donation of \$10,000 each year.

The IN Group support makes a huge difference to the research carried out and to the children who contract GBS/CIDP and donations have gone towards research, salaries of fellows – the young trainee doctors, and purchase of machinery.

Just two examples are a new nerve conduction machine purchased two years ago which is used for teaching, and the purchase of a walking mat which allows clinicians to research how children walk to make sure they receive the best available therapies possible. This leads to published research which is to the advantage of children and adults alike.

Andrew also introduced Dr Eppi Yiu, Head, Neuromuscular at the Royal Children's Hospital and Adelaide Krania, Philanthropy Coordinator, the Royal Children's Hospital Foundation, with him today.

He said this visit was somewhat by way of "good bye and hello" as that although he would maintain contact with the group, he was handing over to Dr Yiu – just the person to lead the department from strength to strength with regard to GBS, CIDP and other neuromuscular research.

Eppi spoke of how she had been at the hospital overnight caring for a GBS patient from country Victoria, and that she considered it a privilege to follow in Andrew's footsteps to be able to continue her passion working with children with inherited and acquired neurological disorders. She mentioned that as a young research fellow, she had been one of several recipients of IN Group donations, so already has an affinity with the group.

Margaret made a special thanks to Andrew for his support over the years and welcomed Eppi to the IN Group, saying that we look forward to seeing her and hearing about the continuing research at the Children's at future meetings.

In answer to Eppi's query on how the IN Group was so successful in raising money, it was agreed that there was a high level of joy among members in raising funds which came from various sources including the Dutch Auction at the annual Christmas Lunch, from other activities organised by Gwen McInnes from time to time, but overwhelmingly it was due to the generous donations of individuals. Because of the heightened awareness of a possible link between COVID vaccinations and GBS in the past three years individual donations might have increased a little, but overall, these donations have, for many years, been consistently at a very high level which we have found so heart-warming.

The annual subscription has been kept to a minimum and the contribution made to the IN Group by committee members is all done on a volunteer basis so that the maximum donation may be made to the Hospital each year, also Margaret sends a handwritten note of thanks to doners. The IN Group may be small, but the support members give is just amazing – thank you to everyone.

INTRODUCING Dr EPPI YIU



Dr Eppi Yiu MBBS Melb 2000 FRACP 2009 Head of Neuromuscular, Royal Children's Hospital Specialising in Paediatrics and Child Health, Paediatric Neurology

Dr Eppie Yiu is a paediatric neurologist at the Royal Children's Hospital Melbourne and an honorary fellow at the Murdoch Children's Research Institute. She underwent training in paediatric neurology at The Royal Children's Hospital Melbourne and The Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto.

She completed her PhD in 2013 in neurogenetic disorders, and she was awarded a NHMRC early career fellowship for her post doctoral studies. She has extensive experience as investigator in both investigator-initiated and industry-sponsored

clinical drug trials in neuromuscular disorders, and recently led development of Clinical practice guidelines for paediatric Charcot-Marie-Tooth disease.
