GBS Association of NSW news

Recently **Patricia Bryant the Executive Office of the GBS/CIDP Foundation International** in America visited Sydney and had an informal lunch meeting with committee members of the GBS Association of NSW.

Dr. Stephen Vucic, Head of the Clinic specifically for CIDP patients at Westmead Hospital, will be their **guest speaker**. The meeting, to be held in the **Charles Brunt Room** (at the end of the corridor), **Ryde Rehab. Centre**, Ryde (enter via Morrison Road), will commence at **10.30 a.m. sharp on Sunday, 23rd October**.

Support

Millie phoned saying her husband was in hospital, newly diagnosed with GBS and he was very concerned because he had lost the expression muscles in his face and couldn't smile at his 12 month old baby. Jan Lane visited him and also Jim Sadler. **"Thank you" to Jan and Jim for your willing assistance**. Terry came out of ICU after having IVIG treatment and he's walking again and doing well.

We had a phone call from **Kathy Dale, of Monash University** who is working on contaminations in drinking water. This is part of the desalination discussions and she said that GBS can be contracted through water contamination. "The people drink the contaminated water, this gives them the gastro and that triggers the GBS." **She wanted to know if any of our people had GBS from contaminated water**. I told her that we hadn't seen this on any of our member questionnaires.

Dorothy told us that Barbara Clifford wondered about that because she had a house in the same area as did I and so did the man who was in the next bed to me at Fairfield hospital. **The water was coming from a dam there and Barbara just wondered if it would have been the water**. (Dorothy and Barbara had GBS many years ago and are valued members of The IN Group.)

I did phone her Cathy back as I realized we have our greatest number of members in a particular suburb of Geelong. She was going to make enquiries through the Geelong hospital regarding the incidences of gastro from that region.

Tom told how he had seen a program on television regarding desalinated water, where they said they take out the salt, but are testing for what bacteria remain.

Gwen told how Andrew Kornberg said they have discovered in children a trigger for GBS was a common childhood bacteria.

A lady from Queensland who was going to be out of a job through her ill health (CIDP) and company changes was advised to go to Centrelink and see a FIS officer who would be able to explain things like the Disability Support Pension. They can also look at your personal financial situation and make suggestions that perhaps you wouldn't know about.

If, for example you are working 3 days a week and you can't travel on public transport due to your disability (balance is a factor here) there may be an allowance you can get which also gives you a Health Care Card. This may not be means tested and can help with medication expenses.

There is usually a payment through your superannuation for disability. She was going to look into these things.

If you are on a Disability Support Pension and you need to buy a new car, it may be free of GST. A certificate may be required. Spare parts for the car may also be GST free.

There is a **Care Plan for people with two chronic diseases or disorders** which can cover things like dental, physio, podiatry, etc. **This plan begins with your GP.** If you are in this category, e.g. you may have CIDP and diabetes, **please speak to your doctor.** If you don't ask about it, you won't be told about it. This may be able to assist with payment for orthotics.

Two Neurological Physiotherapists from Sunshine Rehab. introduced two new members. From the conversations it seems physiotherapy for GBS/CIDP patients has changed over the years. More on that in the New Year.
